MINUTES July 11, 2022

The City Council of Badger met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. at Badger City Hall with Mayor Chris Wendell presiding. Council members present: Pam Smith, Larry Dunbar, Roger Curtis and Teresa Larson-White. Absent: Gail Higgins. Also present: Nate Jones. Motion to approve the agenda was made by Smith, second by Curtis, all ayes, motion carried. Motion to approve the consent agenda was made by Dunbar, second by Larson-White, all ayes, motion carried. Consent agenda consisted of minutes from the June 13th regular meeting and June 27th special meeting, Clerk/Treasurer report for June, and current bills in the amount of \$49,384.56. Mayor Wendell asked if there was any unscheduled business and there being none, the mayor proceeded with the Library Director report. Tammy Jones submitted her written report on library activities and happenings but was unable to attend. Next on the agenda was Public Works Department reports. Water/Wastewater Operator Craig Larson submitted his written report to Council but was unable to attend. He reported on amounts of water/sewage production/disposal for June and the conditions of the lagoons. Todd Tolliver, Public Works, provided his written report to Council which included numerous maintenance tasks, work with equipment, utility locates, etc. Glenda Rasmussen, City Clerk, presented her written report to Council. Clerk will attend the Municipal Professionals Academy July 27th-29th and the office will be closed. Under Council reports, Curtis mentioned he had a report about fireworks. Mayor had nothing to report. Under regular agenda items, the intersection of P59 and 2nd Ave SE was again discussed. Webster County Engineer had provided information regarding the intersection and the signs marking the tintersection have replaced. Rumble strips are not an option since there is no stop sign, and speed signs are cost prohibitive. A motion to approve a quote from CEC Electric for electrical wiring and a meter installation per MidAmerican Energy at the park was made by Larson-White, second by Smith, all ayes, Higgins absent, motion carried. An animal control incident that took place on 7/7/22 was discussed. Council directed the clerk to send a nuisance abatement to the dog owner. Resolution 7-01-2022 Approving a 28E Agreement between Webster County and City of Badger for police protection from Webster County Sheriff was moved by Larson-White, second by Dunbar, all ayes, Higgins absent, motion carried. There being no other business, motion to adjourn was made by Dunbar, second by Curtis, all ayes, motion carried. Adjournment at 7:24 p.m.
